GAME NOTES VS. UNION (OCT. 18-19)

SCOUTING THE DUTCHWOMEN

Union (2-3-0) comes into this weekend on a three-game losing streak with two narrow losses to touted Northeastern (2-1) and No. 7 Boston University (3-2) last weekend. Prior to that, Union had won its first two games over Connecticut (3-2) and Providence (5-2) before the Friars took a 6-2 decision. The Dutchwomen score at a 2.6 goals per game clip, while giving up three goals a game. Leading the offense has been sophomore Courtney Turner with two goals and four assists, all of which game in the season's first three games. Christine Valente has a team-high three goals, including one against BU. In net, the Dutchwomen are aided by the exploits of junior Shenae Lundberg (2-3-0, 2.76 GAA, .916 save percentage). Lundberg has seen nearly all the time in net for Union since arriving on campus, compiling a 9-35-3 overall record in 47 starts, a 3.15 GAA and .901 save percentage.

LAST SEASON VS. UNION

Penn State and Union met for the first time last season at Messa Rink in Schenectady, N.Y. The Dutchwomen skated away victors in both matchups, 1-0 and 2-1. Celine Whitlinger made 48 saves in the opener, allowing just a lone tally with four minutes left in the game. The next day. Penn State found itself two goals down four minutes into the third period before Jess Desorcie but the lead in half. Nevertheless, PSU couldn't find the equalizer. Nicole Paniccia stopped 34 Union efforts.

PENN STATE HAS A #NEWDEN

On Sept. 6, Mortensen Construction turned the keys over to Penn State and its new \$90 million home, Pegula Ice Arena. The Nittany Lions host 17 games in the state-of-the-art arena that seats 5,782 beginning with a series vs. Union (Oct. 18-19). The Nittany Lions host an eightgame home stand over 23 days. Friday night's opening ceremonies will bring back Penn State hockey alums including former coach Billie Willits and former Penn State goaltender and 2008 Miss Virginia Tara Wheeler.

YOUTH SUPPLIES THE OFFENSE

The four additions of freshmen Laura Bowman, Amy Petersen, Sarah Nielsen and Kelly Seward have injected an instant bump in scoring production with 10 of the team's 22 points. Bowman and Seward have each tallied two goals, while Nielsen (4 assists) and Petersen (2) combined for six assists. To prove the youth of the team, 18 of the team's 22 points (81.8%) were collectively tallied by freshmen and sophomores.

LIONS SEARCHING FOR FIRST WIN OVER **ECAC HOCKEY**

Last season the Nittany Lions went 0-5-0 against teams from ECAC Hockey and Quinnipiac pushed that record to 0-7-0. The Union games are the two of seven matchups against the ECAC, which is comprised of seven Ivy League teams and five other Northeastern schools.

PENN STATE TRIPPED UP BY QUINNIPIAC

The Nittany Lions' first trip to Hamden, Conn., home of the 2014 Women's Frozen Four, ended in a pair of defeats to Quinnipiac on Oct. 11-12. The Bobcats pulled away from PSU late for a 5-1 win on Friday and shutout the Nittany Lions 4-0 the next day. Nicole Paniccia made 48 saves in the opener, which saw PSU down one midway through the second period following Shannon Yoxheimer's second goal of the saeson. Goaltender Celine Whitlinger did everything possible in Saturday's game, but her 55 saves weren't enough.

LIONS POST UNDEFEATED WEEKEND

The Nittany Lions opened their second season in impressive fashion with a 1-0-1 weekend at Vermont. Shannon Yoxheimer notched three points and the Nittany Lions played to a 3-3 tie with Vermont at Gutterson Fieldhouse on Friday night (Oct. 4). Twice Penn State trailed and each time PSU responded with a tying goal. Freshman Kelly Seward scored the game's opening goal and Taylor Gross tied things up at two in the third period. Senior goaltender Nicole Paniccia was spectacular in net making

Penn State scored three of the game's final four goals to defeat Vermont, 4-2, on Saturday afternoon (Oct. 5) at Gutterson Fieldhouse. **Hannah Hoenshell** tallied a game-high three points on a goal and two excellent assists, while freshman **Laura Bowman** scored her first two collegiate goals. Hoenshell was a game-high plusfour, while Bowman and fellow linemate **Amy Petersen** carded plus-three ratings. Sophomore goaltender **Celine Whitlinger** saved 37 Catamount shots as Penn State went 1-0-1 in its season-opening series. The Nittany Lions improved to 2-1-1 all-time against Vermont.

HOENSHELL, SEWARD EARN CHA AWARDS Penn State forward Hannah Hoenshell and defender Kelly Seward were named College Hockey America's Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively, on Monday, Oct. 7.

A crafty forward with incredible stick skills, Hoenshell propelled Penn State to an undefeated weekend at Vermont, supplying three points and a game-high plus-four rating in Saturday's 4-2 win. Hoenshell was involved in three of Penn State's four goals, tallying a goal and two assists. Her goal was her second career game-winning goal.

Seward was fantastic on both sides of the ice this weekend as she tallied two goals, which ties for the team high after two games. Seward posted a plus-two rating and seven blocked shots for the weekend as well. In both games, Seward scored Penn State's first goal. On Friday it was a power-play tally and Saturday it was a game-tying goal in the first period.

BRING 'EM BACK

Penn State brings back 24 of its 27 members from last year's team. In those 24 student-athletes, Penn State returns its top 14 scorers and almost 99 percent of its offense along with every member of its stout goaltending corps.

YOXHEIMER MAKES HER MARK

Leading the team in scoring last season was **Shannon Yoxheimer**, a left-handed forward.

Yoxheimer buried 14 goals with 17 assists for a grand total of 31 points, all team highs. She led College Hockey America in shots (169) and put away three power play goals as well as a teamhigh three game-winning goals. Yoxheimer's numbers ranked her in the top 10 nationally in goals, points and assists for rookies. The CHA coaches named Yoxheimer to the All-Rookie team.

THE PANICCIA WALL

Senior goaltender **Nicole Paniccia** excelled between the pipes for the Blue and White last year, stopping 1,028 shots with a 92.8 save percentage. Paniccia's save tally was second in all of NCAA Division I, topped only by fellow CHA upstart Lindenwood's Nicole Hensley. Paniccia was in net for six of PSU's seven victories last year as well as both of Penn State's ties.

POWER-PLAY HOLDCROFT

Sophomore forward **Jill Holdcroft** was lethal on the power play last season, scoring six of her 10 goals last year on the advantage. Despite missing the CHA playoffs at RIT, Holdcroft still ranked second on the team in scoring (10 goals) and added two assists for good measure.

IN THE THICK OF THINGS

Penn State's record of 7-26-2 last season is a little deceiving when considering how close the Nittany Lions were in many of their losses. In fact, 12 of the 26 losses were decided by two goals or less. This year, the Nittany Lions look to change their fortunes in spite of a 1-6-2 record games decided by less than a goal.

CAPTAINS' CORNER

Senior forward **Taylor Gross** once again leads Penn State as its first captain following her first year with the letter in 2012-13. Gross was second on the team in points (22) and assists (15) last season with 34 appearances. The University of Connecticut transfer appeared in 48 games for the Huskies before joining Penn State's club side in January 2012. Senior forward **Jenna Welch** and **Lindsay Reihl**, a graduate student defender, reprise their roles as assistant captains this year. Joining the veteran trio is **Jordin Pardoski**, a vocal sophomore defender who is a first-year assistant captain.

NEW NITTANY LIONS

Four freshmen join the Nittany Lions for the 2013-14 campaign. Minnesota forwards Laura Bowman, Amy Petersen and Sarah Nielsen provide an instant dose of goal scoring from their high school success. Defender Kelly Seward of New York is the tallest Nittany Lion blueliner.

FIRST HEAD COACH

A 1991 graduate of Penn State, head coach **Josh Brandwene** is the first to lead the Nittany Lions. Brandwene compiled a 7-26-2 record last season with 17 freshmen on the team. A four-year hockey player at PSU, Brandwene brings 20 years of coaching experience to Happy Valley.

CONTINUING PENN STATE HOCKEY

Seven members of the current varsity team played for the women's club team at some point. Graduate student Lindsay Reihl along with juniors Cara Mendelson, Katie Murphy, Madison Smiddy and Tess Weaver played all of the 2011-12 season for head coach Josh Brandwene in Penn State's last year at the club level. Taylor Gross and Jess Desorcie joined the five aforementioned players midway through the season in preparation of the 2012-13 season.

NEXT TIME OUT

Penn State continues its eight-game home stand when it faces New Hampshire on Saturday-Sunday, Oct. 26-27 at Pegula Ice Arena. The matchups between Penn State and New Hampshire will be the first on the ice in women's hockey.
