Games 1 & 2: Notre Dame at Penn State

OVERVIEW

▶ The Irish open the 2015-16 regular season with a two-game road series at Penn State (Oct. 16-17).

▶ This season marks Notre Dame's 48th year of varsity hockey, and the 11th under the guidance of Head Coach Jeff Jackson.

▶ Notre Dame went 1-0-1 last weekend in a pair of exhibition games, including a 7-5 win over Guelph at the Compton Family Ice Arena (Oct. 9) and a 2-2 tie against the UNSTDP U-18 team at the USA Hockey Arena (Plymouth, Michigan) on Sunday, Oct. 11.

AGAINST PENN STATE

▶ This weekend's series will mark the first time Notre Dame and Penn State are meeting since Penn State became a NCAA Div. I program (2012-13).

▶ The Irish did play the Nittany Lions four times between the 1983-84 and 1984-85 seasons, with the Irish posting a 3-0-1 record in those four games.

▶ The last meetings in that stretch opened Notre Dame's 1984-85 season (Nov. 2-3) and included an 8-2 win and a 10-3 win.

▶ Notre Dame is 1-4-0 in two seasons of play against the Big Ten (1-3-0 vs. Minnesota, 0-1-0 vs. Ohio State).

SEASON OPENERS

▶ The Irish are 23-22-2 in season-opening games, including a 4-6-0 mark under Head Coach Jeff Jackson.

▶ Friday's game will mark the first time Notre Dame is opening a season away from Notre Dame, Indiana since the 2012 Ice Breaker Tournament in Kansas City, Missouri (neutral site wins over Maine and Nebraska Omaha).

► The last time the Irish had true back-to-back road games to open a season was in 2011 when the Irish split a weekend series at Minnesota Duluth.

PENN STATE AT A GLANCE

► The Nittany Lions opened the year with a 6-1 win at Canisius last Saturday (Oct. 10) and also skated to a 5-2 home exhibition win over Windsor (Oct. 4).
 ► In the win at Canisius, Curtis Loik and David Goodwin each had a goal and two assists, David Glen had two goals and Kenny Brooks had two assists to pace the offense.
 ► Penn State finished the game 2-for-3 on the power play, including power-play goals by Goodwin and Glen.
 ► In net, junior goaltender Eamon McAdam made 27 saves, yielding one power-play goal in the third period.
 ► McAdam (5-4-1, 3.13, .910) and senior Matthew Skoff (7-6-2, 2.81, .907) both return to the Nittany Lion net after playing significant minutes in 2014-15.

► McAdam was a third round New York Islanders draft pick in 2013 and he was also a teammate of Notre Dame goaltender Cal Petersen with the Waterloo Black Hawks from 2011-2013.

► The Nittany Lions went 13-2-3 last season at Pegula (an .806 winning percentage, which ranked second in NCAA Division I).

NOTRE DAME 2, USNTDP U-18 2 (OT)

► The Irish skated to a 2-2 overtime tie with the USNTDP U-18 team on Sunday afternoon at the USA Hockey Arena (Oct. 11).

► Justin Wade scored late in the second period to tie the game at 1-1.

► Mario Lucia then scored a power-play goal early in the third period to put the Irish up 2-1 but then Kieffer Bellows scored a power-play goal for Team USA later in the third, forcing the eventual 2-2 tie.

► In the Notre Dame net, Cal Petersen finished with 33 saves.

► Both teams finished the game 1-for-2 on the power play.

NOTRE DAME 7, GUELPH 5

► Notre Dame hockey opened its 2015-16 season with a 7-5 victory over the University of Guelph on Friday night at the Compton Family Ice Arena (4,165).

► In a game that featured over 40 penalty minutes, six players scored for the Irish, led by freshman defenseman Dennis Gilbert's two goals and two assists.

► Notre Dame started fast as Luke Ripley scored just 1:10 into the game and Anders Bjork put the Irish up 2-0 just 34 seconds later.

► Though Guelph fought back to tie the game at 2-2 and then 3-3, the Irish built a 5-3 win at the end of the second period and went on to

win 7-5.

► In the Irish net, Chad Katunar (six saves) and Cal Petersen (nine saves) each played half of the game.

► The Gryphons' Andrew D'Agostini and Scott Stajcer also split time, with D'Agostini making 17 saves in the first period and a half and Stajcer making 12 to stops in relief.

► Notre Dame finished 3-for-7 on the power play, while Guelph was 4-for-8 with the man advantage.

► Freshmen Joe Wegwerth, Andrew Oglevie (1-0-1), Dylan Malmquist (0-2-2), Jack Jenkins and Dennis Gilbert (2-2-4) made their first career appearances in an Irish uniform and accounted for three goals and four assists.

► Seven Irish skaters finished with multiple points on the night, including Dennis Gilbert (2-2-4), Thomas DiPauli (0-2-2), Connor Hurley (0-2-2), Anders Bjork (1-1-2), Dylan Malmquist (0-2-2), Jake Evans (1-1-2) and Jordan Gross (0-2-2).

TELEVISION: NBC BACK FOR THIRD SEASON

► Notre Dame will once again be one of the most televised college hockey teams in the country.

► NBC Sports Group announced on Oct. 13 that NBCSN will televise 10 Irish home games during the 2015-16 season.

► Those NBCSN games will be against Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 24), Minnesota (Nov. 7), Massachusetts (Dec. 5), Western Michigan (Jan. 8), Merrimack (Jan. 15-16), Maine (Feb. 12-13) and Boston University (Feb. 26-27).

► In addition, Irish home games against Minnesota Duluth (Oct. 23), Minnesota (Nov. 6) and Northeastern (Nov. 12) will be produced and televised through the American Sports Network (ASN).

► One or two weeks prior to those games, ASN will announce the networks that will carry each broadcast.

► Two Notre Dame road contents will be televised by the CBS Sports Network (CBSSN), including Jan. 1 at Denver and Jan. 9 at Western Michigan.

► Each home game will also be available online via NBC Sports Live Extra--the NBC Sports Group's live streaming product for desktops, mobile devices, and tablets.

► For desktops, NBC Sports Live Extra can be accessed at NBCSports.com/liveextra.

► The NBC Sports Live Extra app for mobile devices and tablets is available at the App Store for iPhone, iPad and iPod touch, and on select Android handset and tablet devices within Google Play.

CAPTAIN FOGARTY

► Head Coach Jeff Jackson announced on Aug. 26 at Notre Dame's season-opening meeting that senior forward Steven Fogarty will serve as the team captain for a second consecutive season in 2015-16.

- ▶ Fogarty becomes the 15th two-year captain in Notre Dame hockey history and the first since T.J. Jindra served as team captain during Jackson's first two seasons behind the Irish bench (2005-07).
- ▶ Fogarty follows in a long line of Irish hockey players from Edina, Minn., to serve as team captain, including Anders Lee ('14), Ryan Thang ('10) and Dan Carlson ('01) in recent years.
- ▶ Fogarty has a family history of natural leadership capabilities: his father, William, is a retired United States Navy Admiral and his older brother, Charles, is currently serving in the Navy.

SENIOR LEADERS

- ▶ Fogarty's classmates Thomas DiPauli, Sam Herr, Mario Lucia and Andy Ryan will serve as alternate captains in 2015-16.
- ▶ Notre Dame's leadership core of Fogarty (113), DiPauli (108), Herr (95), Lucia (114) and Ryan (86) have combined to play 516 career games.
- ▶ Fogarty (2013-15), DiPauli (2013-15), Herr (2013-15), Lucia (2013-15) and Ryan (2014-15) have earned 14 combined monograms (varsity letters) over the past three seasons.
- ▶ Lucia's father, Don - a Notre Dame graduate and the current head coach at Minnesota - also served as an alternate captain during his senior season with the Irish (1980-81).

YOUNG GUNS

- ▶ According to research conducted by College Hockey Inc. (@Collegehockey), entering the 2015-16 season, the Notre Dame roster is the fifth-youngest in the country (as of Oct. 1, 2015).
- ▶ The top-five youngest teams entering the season include Boston College (20 years, 169 days), Boston University (20 years, 179 days), Michigan (20 years, 235 days), Wisconsin (20 years, 320 days) and **Notre Dame (20 years, 333 days)**.
- ▶ Notre Dame's roster includes 15 underclassmen (nine sophomores and six freshmen).

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

- ▶ The Irish will once again play a highly competitive slate in 2015-16, including 12 games against the USCHO.com's Preseason Top-10.
- ▶ Those 12 games include two-game series with No. 1 Boston College, No. 2 Minnesota Duluth, No. 3 Boston University, No. 5 Denver, No. 7 Providence and No. 9 Minnesota.

USA WORLD JUNIOR CAMP & STAFF

- ▶ Notre Dame sophomore Anders Bjork took part in USA Hockey's National Junior Evaluation Camp on August 1-8 in Lake Placid, New York.
- ▶ The evaluation camp was the first step in USA Hockey preparing to set a roster for the 2016 World Junior Championships.
- ▶ Camp was pared down throughout the week, but Bjork stayed for the entirety of the week.

- ▶ This year's installment of the World Junior Championships will be held from Dec. 26, 2015, to Jan. 5, 2016, in Helsinki, Finland.
- ▶ In addition to potentially having Bjork on the roster, the support staff will have a decidedly Notre Dame flavor to it as Irish coordinator of hockey operations, Nick Siergiej, will join the squad as its video coordinator.
- ▶ Additionally, Notre Dame equipment manager, Dave Gilbert, will serve in that same role for Team USA.

PETERSEN BETWEEN THE PIPES

► Sophomore goaltender Cal Petersen will be looking to pick up where he left off after turning in an impressive second half during his freshman season.

► Down the stretch last season, he earned either the Hockey East's Player of the Week, Defensive Player of the Week or Rookie of the Week honor for five consecutive weeks between Feb. 9 and March 9.

► Highlighting that streak was his NCAA Division I record 87-save performance in Notre Dame's 4-3 quintuple overtime loss to Massachusetts in the Hockey East playoffs first round (March 6).

► Last February, Petersen led the nation by posting a .962 save percentage, stopping 279 of the 290 shots he faced.

FAMILY TIES

► Sophomore forward Anders Bjork is part of the fourth Notre Dame hockey-playing son to follow his father to Notre Dame.

► His dad, Kirt Bjork, was an All-America at Notre Dame during the 1982-83 campaign and is tied for 12th on Notre Dame's all-time points list with 161, after notching 76 goals and 85 assists in 141 career games.

► Kirt is currently a director of regional development in Notre Dame's development office.

► Anders Bjork also has another family tie to Irish hockey, as his cousin is former Irish standout Erik Condra, who is currently a member of the Tampa Bay Lightning.

► As the fourth son to follow his father to Notre Dame, Anders joins current Irish left wing Mario Lucia (Don Lucia) and graduated players Kevin Nugent (Kevin Nugent, Sr.) and Rory Walsh (Brian Walsh) to play at Notre Dame after their fathers.

► For the fourth time in as many seasons, father and son will face off against each other when Minnesota plays at Notre Dame on Nov. 6-7.

► Don Lucia, a 1981 Notre Dame graduate and the head coach of the Gophers, played four seasons (1977-81) at Notre Dame for Coach

Lefty Smith.

► As a defenseman, he saw action in 124 games, scoring seven goals with 23 assists for 30 points.

► Now in his 17th season as the head coach at Minnesota, Lucia has been a collegiate head coach for 29 seasons.

► In five games versus his dad's team, Mario has two goals and one assist for three points.

► A second member of the Minnesota coaching staff, associate head coach Mike Guentzel, also sent a son to Notre Dame: Ryan Guentzel '11 played for Jeff Jackson at Notre Dame from 2007-11 and was a member of two Frozen Four teams (2008 and 2011).

FIVE FORMER PLAYERS OPEN NHL SEASON

► Five former Notre Dame hockey players have made season-opening rosters, including Ian Cole (Pittsburgh), Erik Condra (Tampa Bay), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Kyle Palmieri (New Jersey) and Riley Sheahan (Detroit).

► Cole enters his first full season on the Penguins' blue line. In March of 2015, he was traded from the St. Louis Blues to Pittsburgh. Cole then re-signed for three more years with the Penguins this past summer.

► Condra, who played in the Ottawa Senators organization for the past six seasons, signed a three-year deal with the Tampa Bay Lightning in June, 2015.

► Also in June of 2015, Lee re-signed with the New York Islanders on a four-year deal. After stints with New York for parts of the 2012-13 and 2013-14 seasons, Lee had a breakout season last year. He scored 25 goals and added 16 assists for 41 points while finishing ninth in the Calder Trophy voting for the league's Rookie of the Year award.

► Palmieri will be making his New Jersey debut after being traded in the offseason from Anaheim to the Devils.

► The Irish also have a large contingent of players who were recently sent to American Hockey League affiliate clubs at the end of various NHL training camps, including Stephen Johns (Dallas organization), Vince Hinostroza (Chicago), T.J. Tynan (Columbus), Robbie Russo (Detroit) and Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh).

THE HAWKS RETURN

► In what has become an annual tradition, the Stanley Cup champion Chicago Blackhawks opened training camp on campus at Notre Dame.

► The team held a season-opening press conference and it's first three days of training camp at Notre Dame's Compton Family Ice Arena (Sept. 17-20).

► Members of the Blackhawks team and staff also attended a football pep rally on Friday afternoon as well as Notre Dame's football game against Georgia Tech on Saturday, Sept. 19 at Notre Dame Stadium.

► The Blackhawks are led by Vice President/

General Manager Stan Bowman, a 1995 University of Notre Dame graduate.

FOURTH-ANNUAL PRO CAMP

▶ Sixteen former Fighting Irish hockey players took part in Notre Dame's fourth annual Pro Camp, which was held from Aug. 31 - Sept. 3 at the Compton Family Ice Arena.

▶ The players returned to campus to begin preparing for various upcoming professional hockey training camps and tryouts.

▶ Camp included practices each morning from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m., in addition to daily scrimmages and lifting sessions.

▶ The roster of attendees included NHL players Erik Condra (Tampa Bay Lightning), Ian Cole (Pittsburgh Penguin), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh Penguins) and Riley Sheahan (Detroit Red Wings).

STAFF ADDITIONS

▶ Head Coach Jeff Jackson announced that Brian Mahoney-Wilson and Mason Graddock have been added to the University of Notre Dame Hockey the staff (Sept. 10).

▶ Mahoney-Wilson is the team's new Volunteer Assistant Coach, while Graddock is the Hockey and Programming Intern.

▶ Mahoney-Wilson joins the Notre Dame program after spending the 2014-15 season as a Volunteer Assistant Coach/Goaltending Coach with the United States Military Academy in West Point, New York.

▶ Mahoney-Wilson graduated from Lake Superior State University in 2011 and was a four-year goaltender for the Lakers.

▶ Graddock spent the previous four seasons as an assistant coach at Middlebury College, where he was the head of recruiting and worked closely with the Panthers' forwards.

▶ Graddock graduated from Middlebury College in 2009 and helped the Panthers to the 2006 DIII Men's Ice Hockey NCAA Championship.

2014-15 RECAP

▶ A young Irish hockey team, which regularly dressed seven or eight freshmen, came together as the year progressed en route to an 18-19-5 record.

▶ The team defeated three top-10 teams in February, including eventual national champion Providence and eventual national runner-up Boston University.

▶ Benefitting from the stronger second half to the season, Notre Dame finished 10-7-5 in Hockey East games, placing fifth of 12 teams in what proved to be the nation's top conference in 2014-15.

▶ Hockey East proved to be the country's top conference in 2014-15 and two of its six best came from Notre Dame as both forward Vince Hinostroza and Russo earned first-team all-conference accolades.

▶ The coupling of Hinostroza and Russo

marked the first time Notre Dame had two first-team all-conference picks in the same season since 1976-77 when Jack Brownschidle and Brian Walsh were both named to the all-WCHA first team.

▶ Additionally, Petersen earned league recognition as he was named as the goaltender on the Hockey East all-rookie team.

▶ The 2015-16 hockey season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 11th season behind the Irish bench. During his first 10 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success. The highly regarded Jackson now has over 29 years of coaching experience. Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson era began in 2005 when the University searched for a man who could move the program among the elite hockey schools in the country.

▶ The veteran coach owned a resume packed with success at the collegiate, junior hockey, professional and international levels.

▶ Throughout his coaching career, Jackson's teams had been successful both on and off the ice and the hope was that he could deliver those same qualities at Notre Dame.

▶ After 10 seasons, it's safe to say the Irish hit a home run with the selection of the popular coach.

▶ During his 10-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams, winning the Central Collegiate Hockey Association's (CCHA) regular-season title twice (2006-07 and 2008-09) while earning three Mason Cup championships ('07, '09 and the final one in 2013). Then in 2013-14, the team's first season in Hockey East, the Irish upset the conference's top team - Boston College - in the quarterfinals to advance to the TD Garden (Boston, Massachusetts) for the Hockey East semifinals.

▶ During Jackson's tenure, his teams have made six trips to the NCAA Tournament (2006-09, 2010-11 and 2012-14), advancing to the Frozen Four twice, playing in the 2008 title game and the 2011 national semifinals.

▶ Since his second season at Notre Dame (2006-07), Jackson's program has been among the top programs in the nation in wins and winning percentage, going 213-125-36 (.618) over the nine-year span.

▶ Between 2006-09, the Irish turned in win totals of 32, 27 and 31 for three consecutive seasons of 25 or more wins and three consecutive NCAA tournament appearances, a first in program history.

▶ Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey - The Compton Family Ice Arena - one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The new

venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.

▶ Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 30 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections. In that same span, 20 players from USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program have matriculated to Notre Dame.

▶ During his tenure, the Irish have had five players garner All-America honors -- Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007. In addition, 12 of Jackson's players have gone on to play in the NHL.

▶ Jackson enters the 2015-16 season with a 16-year collegiate record of 408-196-65 for a .658 winning percentage, the second-best percentage among all active Division I coaches with five years or more in Division I. His 408 career wins rank seventh among active coaches.

▶ In Jackson's first 10 seasons with Notre Dame, the Irish have played with poise and discipline, relying on team defense, strong goaltending and excellent special teams play. They also laid the foundation for future seasons with major success on the recruiting trail.

▶ In taking over the Irish coaching duties in 2005, Jackson became the first Notre Dame head coach to have won an NCAA Division I championship with another program before being hired as an Irish head coach.

▶ Success is nothing new for Jackson at the NCAA Division I level. In six years as the head coach at Lake Superior State (1990-96), Jackson's teams won two NCAA titles in 1992 and 1994 (also advancing to the finals in 1993), two CCHA regular-season championships (1991 and 1996) and four CCHA Mason Cup trophies (1991, 1992, 1993 and 1995).

▶ A 1978 graduate of Michigan State University with a degree in communications, Jackson followed with an education degree from Michigan State in 1979.

▶ In May 2003, Inside College Hockey, ranked Jackson 12th on its list of the 16 greatest college coaches of all-time with only five of the 16 still active in coaching.

▶ Jackson is a member of the USA Hockey Coaches Achievement Program, the American Hockey Coaches Association and the National Hockey League Coaches Association.
