BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- All six schools will be in action this weekend, including a pair of teams hosting non-conference games on home ice. No. 19/- Penn State opens the weekend slate by hosting Canisius in a Friday-Saturday series. Michigan State plays host to Princeton on Friday night, while No. 11/11 Michigan, No. 12/12 Minnesota, No. 15/14 Ohio State and Wisconsin will each play two games on the road. The Wolverines will travel to Vermont and Dartmouth, the Golden Gophers take on Clarkson and No. 18/- St. Lawrence, the Buckeyes will travel to Niagara and the Badgers will head to No. 18/- St. Lawrence and Clarkson.

- Minnesota currently ranks second nationally in scoring offense. The Golden Gophers, who have scored at least six goals in three of their four contests, pace all Big Ten teams with 4.75 goals per game. Individually, Minnesota's Tyler Sheehy currently ranks fourth in the nation and first in the league in points per game (2.00). Sheehy also paces the conference in assist scoring, averaging 1.25 assists per game.

- Three Big Ten goalies are ranked among the top eight netminders in the nation this season in terms of save percentage, including a pair of Michigan freshmen in the top six. Michigan's Hayden Lavigne leads the conference and ranks fourth in the country with a .954 save percentage, with teammate Jack LaFontaine two spots behind him at .946. Ohio State senior Matt Tompkins follows in eighth at .936.

- Ohio State's Nick Schilkey, and Penn State's Nate Sucec and Andrew Sturtz lead the Big Ten in goal scoring with four goals apiece.

- Minnesota goalie Eric Schierhorn was among the 20 players named to the watch list for the 2017 Mike Richter Award, which annually honors the most outstanding goaltender in NCAA Division I men's hockey and is named after former Wisconsin netminder Mike Richter. Schierhorn was named the 2016 Big Ten Goaltender of the Year as well as a first-team All-Big Ten honoree. The winner of the fourth annual Mike Richter Award will be announced at the 2017 NCAA Men's Frozen Four in Chicago.

- The 2016-17 Big Ten hockey season will feature an extensive slate of television coverage, with more than 65 total games. The lineup is highlighted by a package of at least 26 national broadcasts to be carried on BTN, with another six on ESPNU and ESPNEWS, along with an additional 34 games to be carried on FOX Sports Regional Networks, American Sports Network, CN900 and Wisconsin Public Television.

- Every game televised by BTN, FOX Sports Regional Networks, American Sports Network, CN900 or Wisconsin Public Television can be streamed nation-wide via the web, smartphones, tablets and connected devices on BTN2Go, BTN's digital extension. All games televised on an ESPN network will also be available on WatchESPN.

- Tickets for the 2017 Big Ten Men's Ice Hockey Tournament, to be held Thursday – Saturday, March 16-18, are currently on sale. The fourth annual Big Ten Tournament will feature all six conference teams in a single-elimination format and will consist of five games that will be covered live nationally by BTN. Tickets can be purchased at the Joe Louis Arena Box Office, all Ticketmaster outlets, by phone at 800-745-3000 and online at www.OlympiaEntertainment.com.

FILLING UP THE AIRWAVES

Big Ten hockey will feature an extensive slate of television coverage this season, including a package of at least 32 games set to be broadcast nationally on BTN, ESPNU and ESPNEWS.

BTN will broadcast at least 26 games with the first taking place on Friday, Dec. 2, when Minnesota hosts Ohio State. Highlighting the BTN regular season schedule will be the Super Saturday - College Hoops & Hockey doubleheader on Jan. 28, when Ohio State will meet Wisconsin on the ice at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The network also will provide live coverage of all five games from the 2017 Big Ten Men's Ice Hockey Tournament in March.

ESPN will televise an additional six contests. ESPN will conclude its slate of Big Ten games on Friday, March 10, when Minnesota hosts Michigan State. All games televised on an ESPN network will also be available on WatchESPN.

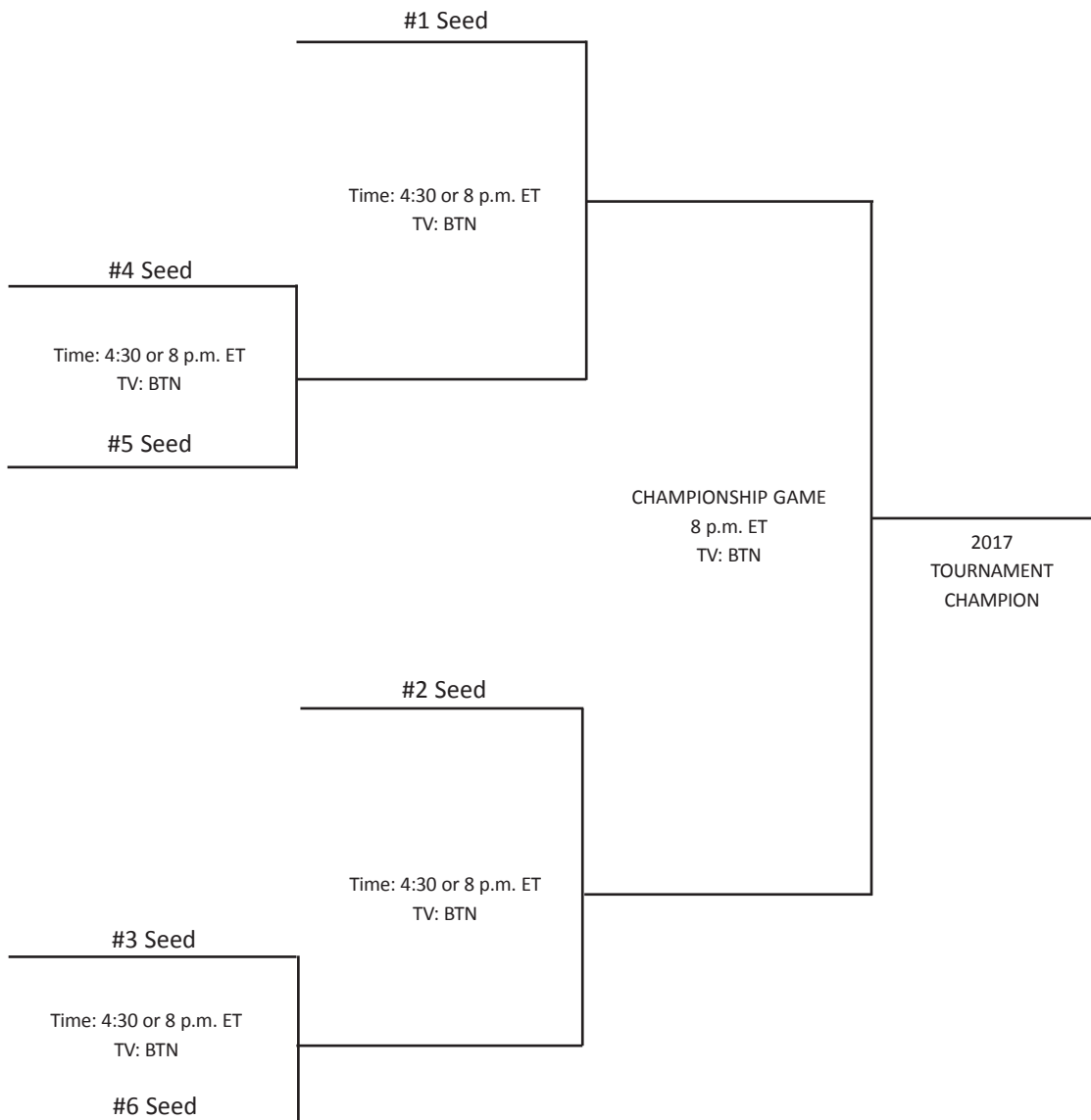
