- Big Ten play opens this weekend with five conference teams in action. The reigning Big Ten Tournament Champion No. 20/- Michigan will open its title defense at No. 7/6 Penn State in a Thursday-Friday series, while No. 10/11 Ohio State will make its road debut against the three-time defending Big Ten Champion No. 11/9 Minnesota for a conference opening Friday-Saturday series. Wisconsin rounds out the weekend welcoming Omaha for nonconference Friday-Saturday series.
- The Big Ten schedule features a 20-game slate with each team playing the other five members four times. During regular-season conference games, shootouts will be utilized to decide contests that remain tied following the conclusion of the five-minute overtime period. Each team will select three players with teams alternating shots. If the shootout remains tied at the end of three rounds, each team will select a different shooter in a sudden-death situation.
- Minnesota head coach Don Lucia earned his 700th career win against college hockey's all-time coaching wins leader, Jerry York, as No. 8/11 Minnesota knocked off No. 4/3 Boston College, 4-2. With the win, Lucia becomes eighth head coach in NCAA history to win 700 games including a school-record 421 victories with the Gophers. York's 1,023 career wins are the most in college hockey history.
- Big Ten teams currently occupy three of the top 10 positions on the national team scoring list, including the top two spots. Penn State leads the country with 4.77 goals per game, followed by Ohio State in second with 4.38. Minnesota is tied for eighth with 3.50 goals per contest.
- After leading the nation in shots on goal per game in each of the last two seasons, Penn State continues to pace all teams with 47.54 this season. The Nittany Lions also lead nationally in shots on goal margin per game, firing 23.69 more shots on the opponents' goal than they allow.
- Penn State's Denis Smirnov paces all conference players and all freshmen across the country with 22 points through 13 games. Smirnov shares the conference lead with 13 assists alongside another freshman, Ohio State's Tanner Laczynski.
- With a Big Ten leading 12 goals on the season, Ohio State's Nick Schilkey is one of only nine players in the country with at least 10 goals so far this season. Schilkey is tied for second in the nation.
- Penn State improved to 11-1-1 on the season following a pair of victories over Arizona State, marking its best record through 13 games in its five-year program history.
- The Nittany Lions are currently riding the second-longest unbeaten streak in the nation at 11 games, going 10-0-1 over that stretch, and have the highest winning percentage (.885) of any team in the country this season.
- A pair of Big Ten freshmen occupy top spots nationally in save percentage and goals-against average. Michigan's Hayden Lavigne ranks third in the nation with a 1.50 GAA, three spots ahead of Wisconsin's Jack Berry at 1.80. Lavigne leads the nation with a .956 save percentage, while Berry ranks 19th nationally with a .920 save percentage.

FILLING UP THE AIRWAVES

Big Ten hockey will feature an extensive slate of television coverage this season, including a package of at least 32 games set to be broadcast nationally on BTN, ESPNU and ESPNEWS.

BTN will broadcast at least 26 games with the first taking place on Friday, Dec. 2, when Minnesota hosts Ohio State. Highlighting the BTN regular season schedule will be the Super Saturday - College Hoops & Hockey doubleheader on Jan. 28, when Ohio State will meet Wisconsin on the ice at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The network also will provide live coverage of all five games from the 2017 Big Ten Men's Ice Hockey Tournament in March.

ESPN will televise an additional six contests. ESPN will conclude its slate of Big Ten games on Friday, March 10, when Minnesota hosts Michigan State. All games televised on an ESPN network will also be available on WatchESPN.

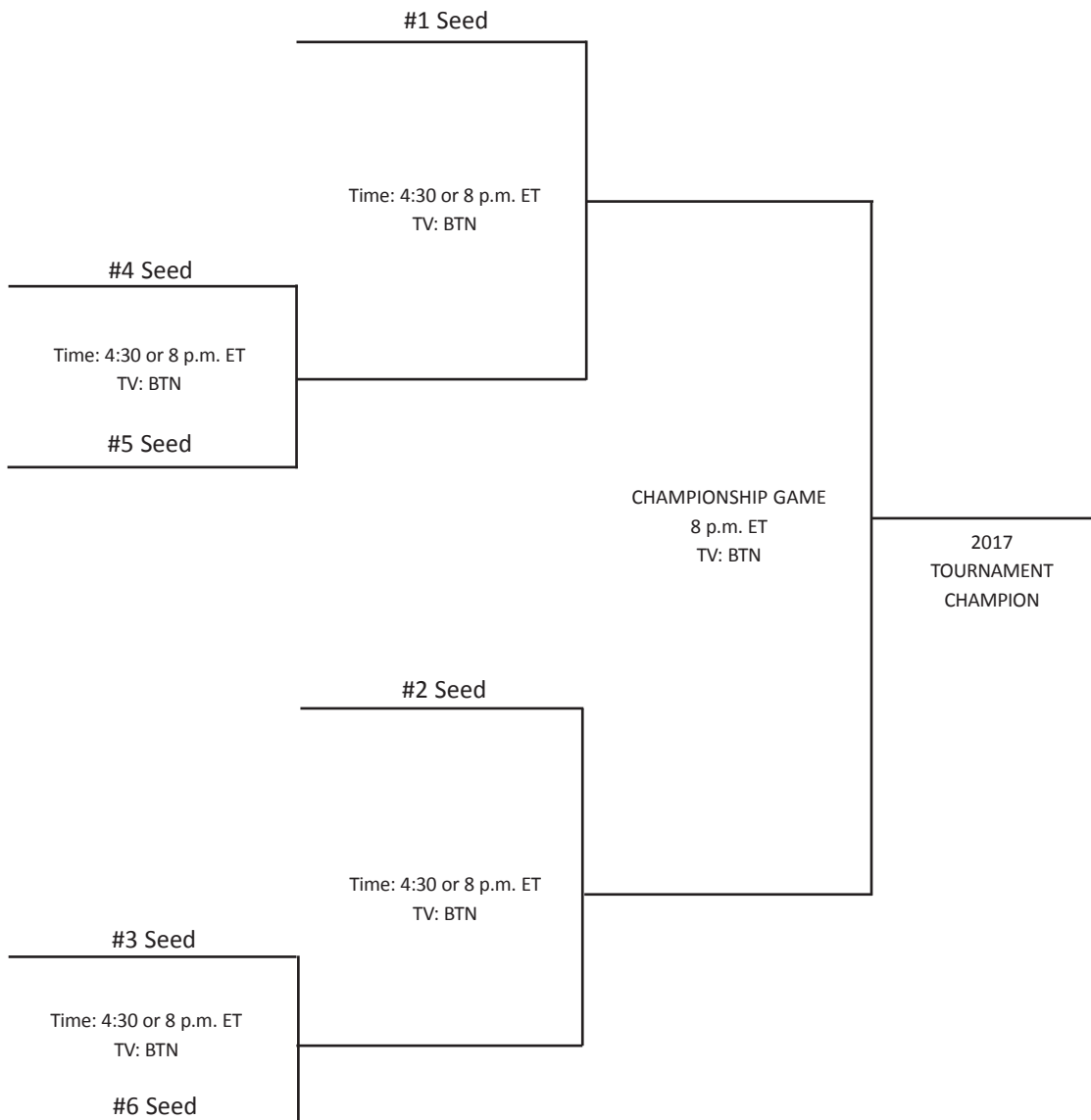
