BIG TEN. BIG NEWS.

- All six schools will be in action this weekend, including five teams hosting non-conference games on home ice. No. 14/15 Penn State opens the weekend slate by hosting Niagara in a Thursday-Friday series. No. 17/- Michigan travels to Arizona State on Friday, while No. 11/11 Ohio State will face Robert Morris in a home-and-home series. Michigan State, No. 13/13 Minnesota and Wisconsin will each host a Friday-Saturday series. The Spartans will host Michigan Tech, the Golden Gophers will take on No. 3/3 North Dakota and the Badgers will welcome Northern Michigan.
- With its 5-0-2 start, Ohio State has opened the season in historic fashion, going undefeated through its first seven games for the first time since the 1983-84 season. That year, the Buckeyes opened the campaign with 13 straight wins en route to the first 30-win season in program history.
- Ohio State is the only undefeated team in the nation that has played more than two games this season. The Buckeyes are 11-1-4 since Feb. 20, with the lone loss coming against Minnesota in the Big Ten Tournament in St. Paul. Ohio State has scored at least four goals in 11 of those contests.
- Wisconsin owns a 4-2-0 record after defeating No. 18/- St. Lawrence and Clarkson over the weekend. The weekend sweep gave the Badgers their best start to a season since 2007-08.
- With a pair of wins over Canisius, Penn State improved to 5-1-1 on the season, marking its best record through seven games in its brief program history. The Nittany Lions lead the nation in shots on goal per game (43.57) and are one of 11 teams in the country average at least 4.00 goals per contest.
- Ohio State currently leads the nation in points with 99. The Buckeyes, who have scored at least five goals in each of their last four contests, pace all Big Ten teams and ranks third nationally with 4.86 goals per game. Individually, Ohio State's Nick Schilkey currently ranks second in the nation and first in the conference in goals, scoring eight goals in seven games.
- Three Big Ten goalies are ranked among the top 15 netminders in the nation this season in terms of save percentage, including a pair of Michigan freshmen. Michigan's Hayden Lavigne leads the conference and ranks seventh in the country with a .944 save percentage, with teammate Jack LaFontaine four spots behind him at .936. Ohio State senior Matt Tompkins follows in 14th at .928.
- Every game televised by BTN, FOX Sports Regional Networks, American Sports Network, CN900 or Wisconsin Public Television can be streamed nation-wide via the web, smartphones, tablets and connected devices on BTN2Go, BTN's digital extension. All games televised on an ESPN network will also be available on WatchESPN.
- Tickets for the 2017 Big Ten Men's Ice Hockey Tournament, to be held Thursday – Saturday, March 16-18, are currently on sale. The fourth annual Big Ten Tournament will feature all six conference teams in a single-elimination format and will consist of five games that will be covered live nationally by BTN. Tickets can be purchased at the Joe Louis Arena Box Office, all Ticketmaster outlets, by phone at 800-745-3000 and online at www.OlympiaEntertainment.com.

FILLING UP THE AIRWAVES

Big Ten hockey will feature an extensive slate of television coverage this season, including a package of at least 32 games set to be broadcast nationally on BTN, ESPNU and ESPNEWS.

BTN will broadcast at least 26 games with the first taking place on Friday, Dec. 2, when Minnesota hosts Ohio State. Highlighting the BTN regular season schedule will be the Super Saturday - College Hoops & Hockey doubleheader on Jan. 28, when Ohio State will meet Wisconsin on the ice at Madison Square Garden in New York City. The network also will provide live coverage of all five games from the 2017 Big Ten Men's Ice Hockey Tournament in March.

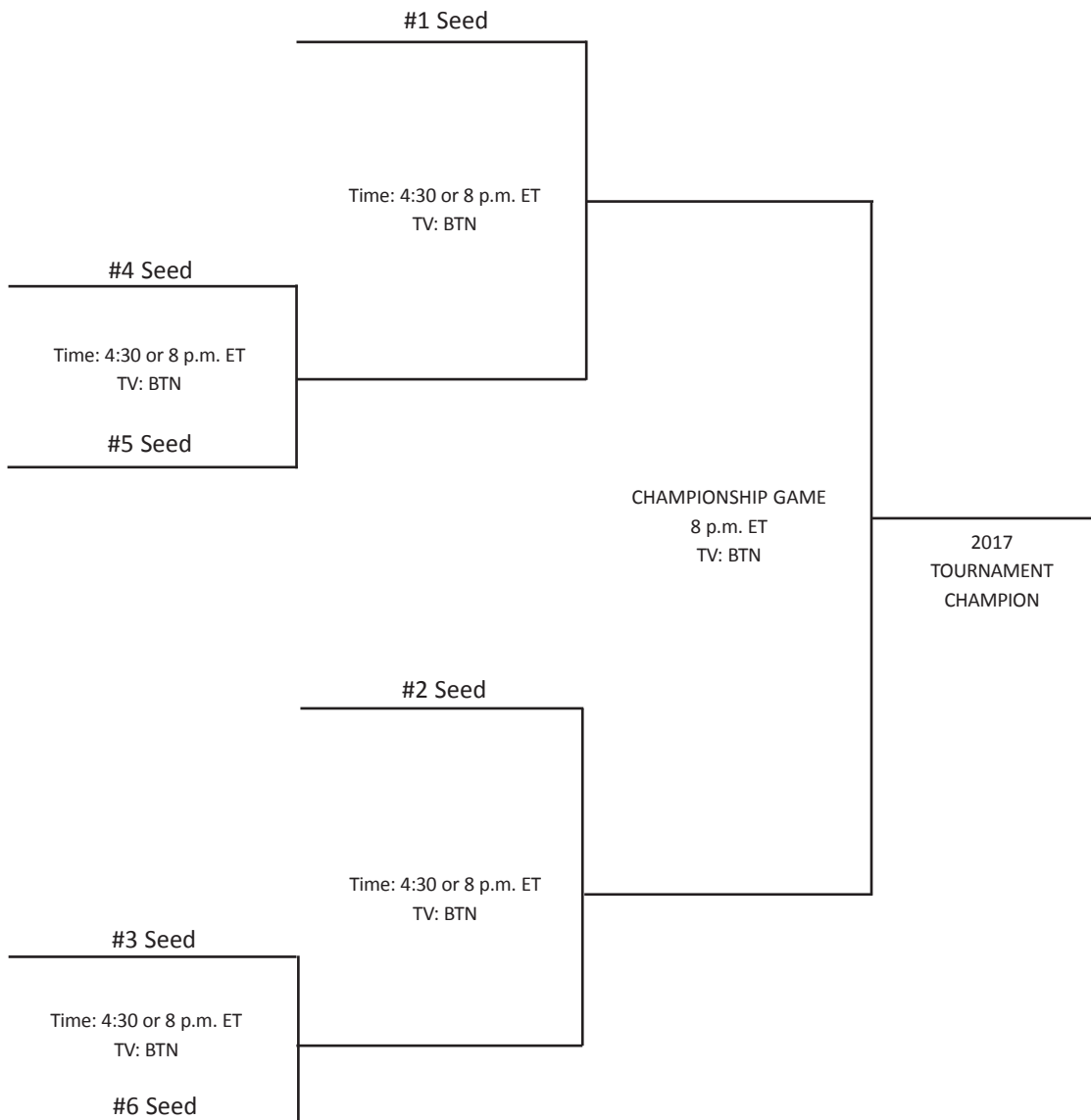
